Residents of the 21st Legislative District are encouraged to stop by either of the events for free assistance to determine if they have unclaimed property as well as help to retrieve what is rightfully theirs.

About one of every 10 Pennsylvanians has unclaimed property – totaling about \$2.3 billion – being held by the state.

Examples of unclaimed property include closed bank accounts, uncashed checks, lost stocks and bonds, contents of safe deposit boxes, expired gift cards and proceeds from demutualization of insurance companies.

Please bring your driver's license or other identification to help find unclaimed property.

There is no cost to search the database, so it's important to be wary of solicitations asking for money to help you retrieve property.
