PASSED THE HOUSE

- On a bipartisan vote, the House recently passed my bill to help the PA Game Commission conserve land in certain counties. H.B. 1811 would remove a price-per-acre cap on PGC purchases in counties of the first through fifth classes; this bill would conserve thousands of additional acres of forest. It is pending in the Senate.
- In June, the House approved my bill aimed at protecting the health of mothers during pregnancy and the postpartum period. H.B. 1088 would require health insurance to cover medically necessary home blood pressure monitors as a pregnancy-related service. It is pending in the Senate.

NEW BIPARTISAN LEGISLATION

With co-sponsors from both sides of the aisle, I have introduced H.B. 1814, which would prohibit students in PA public schools from using or possessing a cell phone during the school day. Students would be required to secure their phones in a way that prevents access until the end of the day, with exceptions for certain emergency and medical needs approved by school authorities. Research is clear that students are harmed by the distraction of smart phones at school.



SIGNED INTO LAW



I am proud that Gov. Josh Shapiro last year signed into law my bill to repeal PA's longstanding ban on Sunday hunting. Act 36 of 2025 will allow Pennsylvanians to enjoy more time in our game lands for recreational hunting; it will bring families together and allow our youth more opportunities to connect intimately with the land, and it will strengthen wildlife conservation efforts in our great state.



SECURING FUNDING FOR WORTHWHILE LOCAL PROJECTS

I want to keep Allegheny County moving forward with available state funding to support our infrastructure, parks, housing, libraries, and first responders, among other worthwhile causes and projects. As a result, I brought home many grants for deserving local projects, including most recently:

- \$1.14 million to Sharpsburg for riverfront development, streetscape and park improvements
- \$837,144 to Allegheny Valley North COG for multiple projects: a generator and roadway maintenance, sanitary pump station in Harrison, and water line in Tarentum
- \$800,000 to Roots of Faith for affordable housing projects
- \$300,000 to O'Hara Township for water infrastructure and sidewalk improvements
- \$275,000 to Springdale Township for Shrader Street waterline replacement
- \$300,000 to Tarentum Borough for utility vehicles
- \$100,000 to East Deer Township for Memorial Park's bandstand and utility building
- \$46,564 to Harmar Township for Highbury Park trail reconstruction
- \$250,000 to Harmar Water Authority for a water plant filter
- \$250,000 to FCP Services Inc. for renovating The Depot in Tarentum
- \$170,640 to Frazer Township for road resurfacing and a skid steer
- \$175,000 to Harrison Township for Olive Avenue storm sewer repairs
- \$50,000 to Deer Creek Drainage Basin Authority for maintenance equipment
- \$49,970 to Fawn Township Sewage Authority for a maintenance vehicle
- \$100,000 to the National Aviary for conservancy greenspace



FIRST RESPONDERS CORNER

I've made it my mission to support local firefighters, police and EMS. Among the grants I've brought home recently:

- \$350,000 to Southern Allegheny Valley Emergency Services for rescue vehicle and renovations
- \$100,000 to Allegheny Valley Volunteer Fire Co. #1 for a vehicle and equipment
- \$85,000 to Harrison Hills Volunteer Fire Co. 169 for parking lot restoration
- \$80,000 to Summit Hose Volunteer Fire Co. for equipment
- \$60,000 to Frazer Township VFD #2 for a vehicle purchase
- \$50,000 to Highland Hose Volunteer Fire Dept. for new gear
- \$50,000 to Allegheny Valley Regional Emergency Management Agency for a vehicle
- \$45,000 to Tarentum Borough for a police drone and associated costs
- \$10,000 to Harrison Township for recruiting and training police officers


