Dear Neighbor,

As we move out of winter and look ahead to spring, I want to take a moment to reflect on the work being done both in Harrisburg and here at home in our district.

Over the past several months, my team and I have hosted numerous community events and mobile office hours throughout the district to bring important state resources and services directly to you. Whether assisting with constituent services, helping residents navigate the red tape of state agencies, or connecting families to vital programs, serving our community remains at the heart of everything I do.

In Harrisburg, we passed a balanced, bipartisan 2025-2026 state budget that makes meaningful investments in education, strengthens our workforce, protects seniors, and supports families and essential services across Pennsylvania. In February, the Governor delivered his annual budget address, officially starting the clock on the next budget, and between now and the fiscal year end on June 30, we are focused on passing another responsible budget for the year ahead.

The 25-26 budget that I voted for includes over \$100 million in increased education funding, including at least \$25 million for the Solar for Schools program, and \$25 million to support the new Childcare Worker Retention and Recruitment program. We also created the new Working Pennsylvanians Tax Credit, which provides up to \$800 in tax relief for eligible workers. If you qualify for the federal Earned Income Tax Credit, you will automatically qualify for the new state tax credit, putting money back into the pockets of hardworking families across our community.

While last year was not without its challenges, please know that I remain committed to working hard on the issues that matter most to our district. I encourage you to reach out to me and my team with your concerns, questions, or ideas. We're always here to help.

Update on MIPC's Underground Gasoline Leak in Aston

I want to provide a brief update on the underground gasoline leak at Monroe Energy's Monroe Interstate Pipeline Company, LLC (MIPC, LLC) Chelsea Tank Farm in Aston Township.

On December 17, 2025, MIPC notified the Department of Environmental Protection that a leak discovered in August 2025 may have released up to 9,000 barrels of fuel, approximately 378,000 gallons. I immediately shared the news publicly so that residents who were impacted could request water testing if they have private wells.

In early February 2026, I attended a public meeting held by MIPC to update residents on recovery and cleanup efforts. DEP shared that a dedicated website, www.chelseatankupdates.com, is being created to post weekly remediation updates and allow residents to submit comments. The site will also include contact information for questions.

Residents may also contact DEP's environmental cleanup team at RA-EP-SEROECB@pa.gov or call 1-866-255-5158 to report concerns. I will continue to follow this situation closely and escalate concerns from our neighbors as they reach out to me.

- ✓ Rebates
- ✓ Insurance Payments *and much more!*

Visit PATreasury.gov/unclaimed-property to search anytime, or contact my office if you need assistance!

Thanks to the new PA Money Match program, certain unclaimed property valued up to \$500 is now returned automatically by PA. That means no searching, no paperwork, and no forms—eligible funds are simply sent back to their rightful owners. Stop by or call my office to see if you have unclaimed property!
