BULK TRASH



Starting January 1, 2025, bulk trash items will be charged based on quantity, with fees determined by one of the following three categories:

1. Items with Freon (refrigerant gas): \$40/item.

Examples: refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier, watercooler, or any item with a cooling component.

2. Items with a Fuel Tank (must be emptied): \$30/item.

Examples: push/riding/tractor lawn mowers, snow blower, or any item with a fuel tank.

3. All other Items: \$20/item.

Examples: furniture, playground equipment, tools, exercise equipment, appliances, microwaves, emptied helium tanks, metal garage doors and openers, basketball poles, grills, trampoline bases, window blinds, water softeners, vacuum cleaners, toys, pool cover, porcelain bathroom fixtures, pool tables, carpeting, glass items, synthetic Christmas tree, child car seats/boosters/cribs/carriers, or any other item not listed WITHOUT Freon or a Fuel Tank.

An Inside Look at Working with a Literary Agent: A Conversation with Seth Fishman



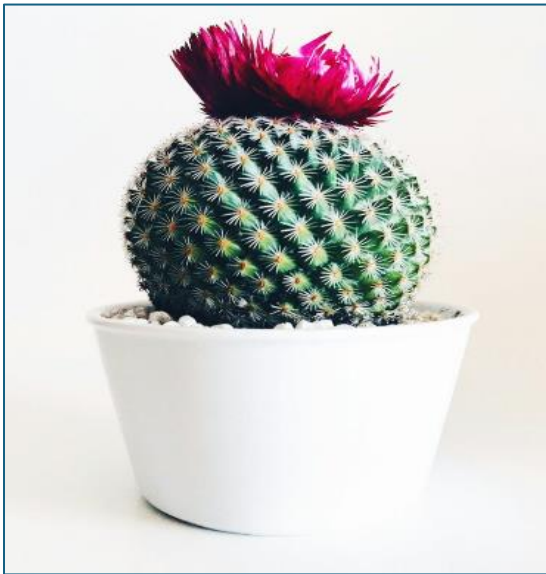
Tuesday, January 28, 1:00 p.m.

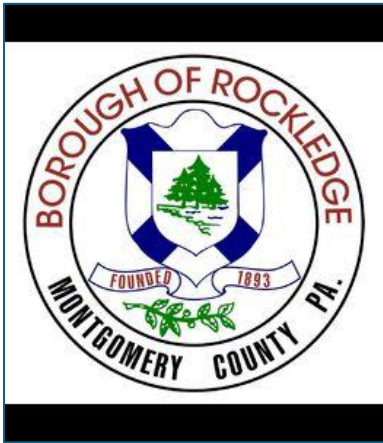
