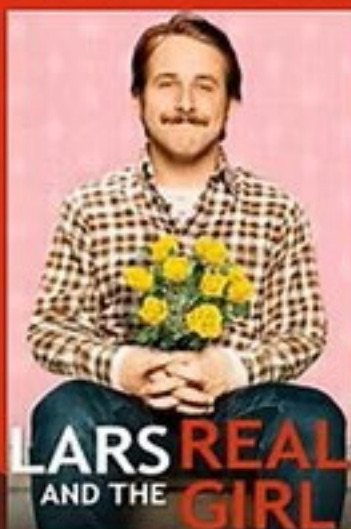

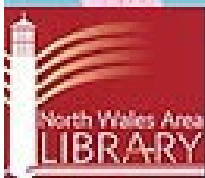

In coordination with the Montgomery County Public Library System (MCLINC), High School District Librarians, and community bookstores, WCMC will lead a county wide book club, featuring the book *Stay* by Author Deb Caletti.

February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month. In February the center will be making it's way through the county to conduct "Talk Sessions". *Stay* is a story about a young girl names Claire who is in an abusive relationship.

The goal is to help teens understand that all decisions that young adults make can shape their future selves, including understanding healthy versus unhealthy relationships. Learning about power and control in relationships at this stage of their dating experience can aid students in recognizing the warning signs or red flags of an abusive relationship.

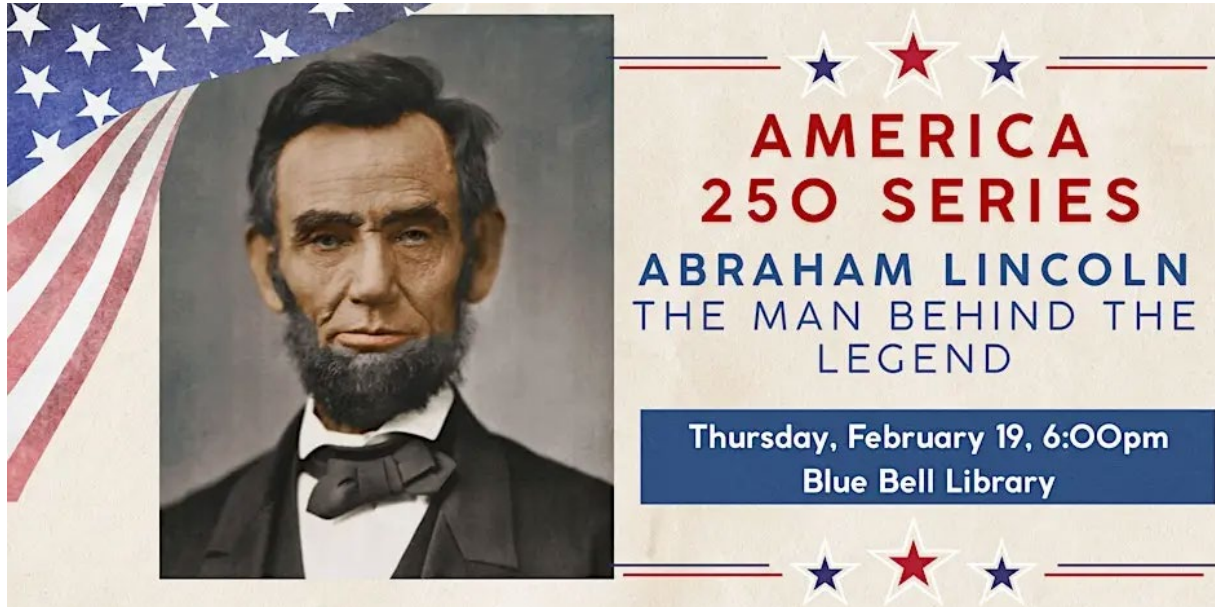
