# Davidson school safety hotline bill becomes law

High-quality education for every child is one of my biggest priorities and having a safe place to learn is a foundational pre-requisite to a high-quality education.

We now have ensured students across the commonwealth will have a way to anonymously report dangerous situations in schools, as my bill was amended into last year's fiscal code, giving the Office of Safe Schools the ability to establish telephone hotlines.

The creation of these hotlines help make our schools safer because students are able to report, anonymously, unsafe situations, or prevent a tragedy like Columbine without any fear of ramifications from their peers. These hotlines not only prevent school crime or violence, but also have been successful in the prosecution and enforcement of school-related crime.

Other states, such as Colorado, have established similar school-related safety hotlines.

The Colorado hotline was the result of a recommendation by the Columbine Review Commission, which conducted a review of the shooting at Columbine High School in 1999 and made recommendations to attempt to prevent similar tragedies in the future

Since the creation of the hotline in Colorado, the results have been dramatic, including:

- · 84 arrests
- 382 counseling referrals
- 457 investigations
- 328 prevention intervention plans and
- 343 school disciplinary actions.

The hotline in Mississippi resulted in the recovery of 14 illegal handguns, and similar results are reported in Missouri, Oklahoma and other states.

# **Davidson supporting a living wage**

This session, I continue to work toward improving the lives of all Pennsylvanians by addressing the need for an increase to our minimum wage.

The current minimum wage, \$7.25 per hour, simply does not provide a livable wage.

For example, a single mother with two children who works 40 hours per week, for 52 weeks a year, makes \$15,080. This is \$4,450 below the poverty line, which is \$19,530 for a household of three. The effects of the low wage are especially felt by women, who account for

two-thirds of workers earning minimum wage. This requires many people to rely on government assistance programs to get by.

Raising the minimum wage puts more money in the pockets of working families when they need it most, boosting their spending power and our economy.

# Davidson honored as Pre-K Champion & Champion of Literacy

In May, Delaware County Pre-K for PA named me as a 2017 Pre-K Champion based on my work supporting early childhood education.

According to the group, I was identified and honored by Pre-K for PA because of my leadership and advocacy for greater access to high-quality pre-k in Pennsylvania communities. New state pre-k funding in the 2015-16 and 2016-17 state budgets was welcome news, as more than 6,000 income-eligible 3- and 4-year-olds were afforded access to programs such as Pre-K Counts and Head Start.

Access to high-quality publicly funded pre-k must remain a priority for the commonwealth in the 2017-18 state budget as more than 113,000 young children across the state lack access to this opportunity.

I've also been named a Champion of Literacy by the Delaware County Literacy Council for my efforts with members of the immigrant population learning English as a second language.

For every dollar we spend teaching children at a young age, we are saving \$7 down the line on incarceration, illiteracy or joblessness. It is a privilege to accept this award for doing something that I support so passionately.

I continue to offer a "Thank You" to all the groups that help make the issue of pre-k funding as simple as it really is: invest in children early to make better, more productive adults later. That's a real solution with real results.

#### Yeadon to receive \$9.5 million low-interest loan for sewer upgrades

Yeadon was awarded a \$9.5 million lowinterest loan to complete sewer upgrades in the borough, as approved by the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority.

The project consists of replacing 12,750 feet of clay pipe, repairing 49 manholes and replacing 217 connections from the sewer line to private property line. Cracks and shifting in the existing pipes is causing inflow and infiltration into the sewer line.

Having solid infrastructure is so important for our communities. This loan allows Yeadon to complete much needed work to ensure the sewer system will be in good shape for years to come.

Pennvest serves Pennsylvania communities by funding sewer, storm water and drinking water projects. The projects contribute to improving Pennsylvania's environment and residents' health, as well as provide jobs and opportunities for economic growth.

### **Lansdowne Borough** receives sewer line grant

I was pleased to announce that Lansdowne Borough received a \$43,208 grant from the Pennsylvania Small Water and Sewer Fund, administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development, to re-line sewer lines in the borough. The funding was released by the Commonwealth Financing Authority as part of DCED's grant program for water and sewer projects. The funds are being used to replace one brick manhole and 219 linear feet of deteriorating clay pipe beneath Pennock Terrace.
