Working for You in Harrisburg

For my first term in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, I've been appointed to serve on three committees: Commerce, Local Government and State Government.

Committees are an important part of the legislation process. Proposed bills are reviewed and debated initially in committees before they move to the House floor.

The Commerce Committee reviews legislation involving the banking and financial services industries. It has oversight of the Department of Banking, Department of Community and Economic Development, Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency, and the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority.

The Local Government Committee reviews bills that affect counties, cities, boroughs and townships. It has oversight of the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System.

The State Government Committee reviews legislation on issues ranging from voting and elections to campaign finance reform. In addition, it oversees the departments of State and General Services, the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission, as well as the Governor's Office and State Athletic Commission, among others.

I look forward to using these committee assignments to work on your behalf, fighting for issues that matter to you and your family, like boosting economic growth and development at the state and local levels and working toward a fair economy.

Fighting for Education



In January, I joined fellow Democratic legislators at the 100% Fair School Funding Now public hearing in Philadelphia. Fair funding for our schools is critically important and something I'm dedicated to push for as your state representative. I am proud to have cosponsored a bill that would deliver fair funding to our public schools, accelerating the implemention of the fair funding formula to 100%.



I joined Strong Start PA to advocate for statewide Pre-K. Pre-K classes have been proven to have substantial benefits, including reducing future spending on literacy and math supports and increasing the chances of students to attend secondary schools and college.

REAL ID

Beginning Oct. 1, 2020, a REAL IDcompliant license or ID card, or a U.S. Passport or Military ID, will be necessary to board a domestic flight or enter a federal facility. A REAL ID license has enhanced security features required by federal law. REAL IDs are available now.

My district office can help you obtain a certified copy of a Pennsylvania birth



certificate. Sending an application through my office is the fastest way to apply for a birth certificate.

Free Notary Services

Most official documents can be notarized for free at my district office. Please call ahead to make sure a notary is available and your document is able to be accommodated. The person whose signature is to be notarized must sign the document in person, in the presence of the notary and provide proof of identity such as a valid driver's license, photo ID card or passport.

SEPTA Senior Key Card Information

Seniors 65 and older are eligible to travel for free on all SEPTA service lines within Pennsylvania.

Seniors must obtain a SEPTA Key Senior ID Card to ride for free. However, valid PA driver's licenses and non-driver ID cards issued before July 2017 will still be accepted until they need to be renewed.

My district office processes applications and takes photos for SEPTA Key Senior ID Cards. Applicants must present a form of identification with a date of birth on it, such as a Pennsylvania driver's license or nondriver ID, U.S. Passport, or birth certificate.

Paper reduced transit fare cards and Medicare cards are no longer accepted.

- Process applications for birth and death certificates
- Provide you with Pennsylvania state tax forms
- Print out federal tax forms whenever possible
- Provide and help you fill out Property Tax/Rent Rebate forms
- Notarize any state form for free
- Process SEPTA Key Senior ID card applications for those 65 and older
- Help you find and claim unclaimed money in your name through the Pennsylvania Treasury
- Notarize and process applications for Disability Parking Placards and Plates
- Field questions or handle problems concerning PennDOT, including complaints about road conditions
- Explain the REAL ID application process
- Assist you with any issues regarding the Department of Human Services and the Montgomery County Assistance Office, including questions about SNAP, Medical Assistance, and
- Provide you with any state form or brochure

- Assist you with unemployment compensation questions or problems
- Field questions or complaints about utilities and the Public Utility Commission
- Provide you with recognition from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for outstanding local accomplishments and family milestones
- Send state forms for you to their appropriate departments in Harrisburg to expedite their processing
- Schedule tours of the state Capitol for individuals or groups
- Answer questions about proposed legislation
