Grants Awarded To The 165th

It is with great joy that I announce our community has received more than \$3.5 million in grants during my first year as your state representative, starting with:

June 13 – \$1.4 million for countywide services in Delaware County, helping families, women and victims of abuse.

Sept. – \$60,000 from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development awarded to the Morton police force for station upgrades.

Sept. 9 – \$40,000 to the Radnor Police Department to purchase body cameras.

Sept. 12 – \$623,963 for countywide services in Delaware County to reduce gun violence and provide aid to victims of abuse.

Sept. 17 – \$125,000 to Veteran's Memorial Park in Marple Township to increase ADA-accessibility of playground equipment.

Sept. 17 – \$250,000 to Friends of Smedley Park in Springfield to help rehabilitate and realign Springfield Trail.

Nov. 1 – \$158,493 from the Pennsylvania Department of Education awarded to Cabrini University in Radnor to help redesign its early childhood education curriculum.

Nov. 1 – \$16,304 from the Pennsylvania Department of Education awarded to Eastern University in St. Davids to help develop a strong system-wide infrastructure.

Nov. 14 – \$200,000 to Veteran's Memorial Park in Marple Township to rehabilitate and further develop the park.

Nov. 14 – \$250,000 to Meadowgreen Park in Springfield to be used toward upgrading its sports field and further develop the park.

Nov. 14 – \$232,000 to The Forge to Refuge Trail in Radnor, which will be used to improve the trail, including the construction of approximately 0.3 miles of trail from Radnor-Chester Road to I-476.

Dec. 17 – \$227,000 for PennDOT light improvements at Powell Road and Saxer Avenue.

Legislative Update

In September, my house resolution urging state agencies to use sensitive language related to suicide, HR 399, moved unanimously out of the House.



I shared my story about losing my father to suicide as a teenager on Suicide Awareness Day (Sept. 25) at the state Capitol.



In Harrisburg and in our community, I've been working toward ending the mental health stigma.

Don't Wait REAL ID Oct. 1, 2020

REAL ID was enacted by the federal government to implement minimum security measures for state-issued IDs and will go into effect in PA on Oct. 1, 2020.

Do I need a Real ID to Drive?

No. You don't need a Real ID to drive, but it will replace your driver's license.

Do I need a Real ID to fly?

Not necessarily. To board a domestic flight, REAL ID or another federally accepted form of ID, such as a passport, will be required.

How much does a Real ID cost?

Your first application will cost \$30 plus a photo ID renewal fee. Every four years, you will only be required to pay a renewal fee.

How do I get a Real ID?

You must visit a PennDOT Driver's License Center. You will be required to present the following documents:

- **One** proof of identity
- Your **Social Security card**
- **Two** proofs of residency
- **Proof** of legal name changes (if applicable)
