Combating the tangled title crisis

More than 10,000 homes in Philadelphia have unclear owners and are caught in what's called a tangled title. This often happens when a person is living in a house that is still in the name of a deceased loved one, like a parent or grandparent.

Tangled titles threaten to keep people from qualifying for home repair assistance or taking out a loan, leave them vulnerable for deed theft, and prevent them from selling or even keeping their house. Research shows areas with tangled titles have higher rates of gun violence, poverty and blight.

In December, I teamed up with the Philadelphia Register of Wills for a webinar to detail the financial and legal aid available to untangle titles and ways to prevent them from happening.

Home heating help is available

Pennsylvania's Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program is again accepting applications.

LIHEAP helps eligible individuals and families cover heating bills through a one-time cash grant sent directly to their heat provider that does not have to be repaid.

Households in immediate danger of being without heat may also be eligible for crisis grants.

Make sure to call my office for help applying for LIHEAP along with information about other financial assistance that utility companies are offering to keep your home warm this winter.



Securing \$4.6 million to improve Delco's 911 system

I am proud to announce \$4.6 million in grant funding will help improve Delaware County's aging 911 system.

The project will revitalize existing emergency communications sites and add new ones.

We must continue making these important investments that strengthen the safety of our neighbors in Darby and Yeadon while supporting our dedicated first responders.

STOP N' GO AND LIQUOR CODE VIOLATIONS

DO YOU KNOW OF A NUISANCE ESTABLISHMENT IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD?
DO YOU NEED TO FILE A COMPLAINT?

IDENTIFY A VIOLATION

1. Insufficient seating
2. Insufficient food items
3. Insufficient eating utensils
4. Selling alcoholic beverages on Sunday from 2 a.m. to 11 a.m.
5. Not a real restaurant
6. Selling alcohol off premises
7. Expired health permit
8. Expired liquor license
9. Selling alcohol to a minor
10. Failure to post "No Smoking" signage

COLLECT EVIDENCE

Record the date and time of the incident, the nature of the incident or inaction, and take time stamped photographs if possible.

WHAT SHOULD YOU HAVE WHEN FILING YOUR COMPLAINT?

Get the liquor license ID number if possible and know the exact address of the nuisance establishment.

Everyone 16 and older eligible for COVID-19 booster shot

People 16 and older who received their second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine at least six months ago or the J&J shot at least two months ago may now schedule a booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccination. I received mine at Sayre Health Center.

Remember, children as young as five can get vaccinated through Pfizer's pediatric immunization.

I can't stress enough that the best defense against COVID-19 is getting vaccinated.
