## Grants & Awards in our District

• **\$450,000 to the Darby Creek Joint Authority, Lansdowne Borough**

to address capacity issues with the Darby Creek Interceptor and manage peak flows, especially under wet weather conditions.

• **\$350,000 to East Lansdowne Borough**

to relocate the East Lansdowne Police Department with the acquisition of a new building.

• **\$167,512 to East Lansdowne Borough**

to construct 52 ADA-compliant curb-cut ramps, add striping to seven crosswalks, replace sidewalk blocks, and relocate signage. Much of this work is to be done along Emerson Avenue, a main thoroughfare for schools, municipal buildings, and emergency service departments.

• **\$224,274 to Delaware County**

to purchase AWARE stream and flood monitors to establish a county-wide flood warning network.

• **\$67,943 to the Delaware County Economic Development Corporation**

to purchase a delivery van for Teachers' Teammates, a school-supply distribution organization that has donated \$2.3 million in school supplies to 75 Delaware County schools since July 2020.

• **\$275,000 to the Darby Creek Joint Authority**

for re-lining the Darby Creek Interceptor MH 99-98.

• **\$122,000 to East Lansdowne Borough**

to purchase two new police cruisers.

• **\$50,000 to Lansdowne Borough**

to begin a streetscape and wayfinding project that will improve pedestrian sidewalks and wayfinding throughout the business district.

• **\$382,500 to Lansdowne Borough**

to replace approximately 500 feet of outdated and deteriorating sanitary sewer infrastructure, including installing new sewer lines and manholes.

# Legislative Update

In the 2025-26 legislative session, I've prime-sponsored 21 bills and resolutions and co-sponsored another 285! Here are some highlights:

## Signed into Law



Senate Bill 88, a companion to my House Bill 433, passed the House on Nov. 19, 2025 (196-7), and was signed into law by Governor Shapiro on Nov. 24.

### Diagnostic Breast Imaging

Requires health insurers to cover the cost of additional diagnostic imaging for breast cancer after an abnormal mammogram.



PASSED THE HOUSE ✓

**HB 1251** allows nurse-midwives to refer patients for pelvic floor therapy, streamlining patient access to care

**H.B. 1251 passed the House on Dec. 17, 2025 (202-1).**

The House works with the Senate and governor to pass legislation that improves our communities. Here are others that were signed into law recently:

### WORKING PENNSYLVANIANS TAX CREDIT

The new Working Pennsylvanians Tax Credit was authorized as part of the 2025-26 budget that we passed last year. It offers eligible families an even greater income tax refund.

### Helping Veterans Continue to Serve

Allows a veteran's service experience in an occupation or trade to count towards that veteran's qualifications to be a Career & Technical Education Instructor and help get students vital job training.

Act 41 of 2025, formerly H.B. 1405, addresses the ongoing teacher shortage in Pennsylvania by making it easier for veterans to obtain a teaching certificate in career and technical education. Many veterans gain direct experience in CTE fields during their time in the service.

### CROWN Act

Protecting against race-based hair discrimination

The PA Crown Act amends the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act to prohibit discrimination based on a person's hair type, hair texture, or hairstyle.

**We're also working to protect vaccine access, protect tenants, raise the minimum wage, and demand better transparency from cyber charter schools.**

## Bills I've introduced since my last newsletter:

### Maternal Healthcare

HB 1851: Allowing nurse-midwives to sign fetal death certificates, streamlining the official process for grieving families.

### Education

HB 2025: Requiring the state to reimburse public schools for interest payments and fees incurred during the General Assembly's 2025 budget impasse.
