HOW MY LEGISLATION SET PITTSBURGH UP FOR SUCCESS WITH THE NFL DRAFT

My legislation, House Bill 467, was signed into law by Governor Josh Shapiro as Act 56. This law removed the seven-day notice requirement for off-site alcohol catering at memorial services, easing an unnecessary burden on grieving families during an already difficult time. The law also expanded special occasion permits, allowing nonprofits to sell alcohol at fundraising events.

Act 56 also established a new six-day sporting events permit for public venues. As majority chair of the House Liquor Control Committee, I worked closely with the Senate to craft language to

give venues the flexibility they need to accommodate nationally recognized events. This ensured Pennsylvania was prepared to successfully host the NFL Draft in Pittsburgh and the FIFA World Cup in Philadelphia.

I'm thrilled these practical solutions helped to make the NFL Draft a great success for Pittsburgh! Over 800,000 people showed up from all over the country and fell in love with our city. We even broke the Round 1 attendance record! Thanks to Act 56, attendees got to enjoy the best of our local breweries, bars, and restaurants.

EXTENDING OPERATING HOURS FOR AMERICA 250 AND THE FIFA WORLD CUP

I was proud to vote for Senate Bill 1218, which was signed into law as Act 8.

The law established a temporary permit allowing bars, restaurants, and nightlife venues to extend operating hours by up to two hours during the FIFA World Cup and America 250 celebrations. Act 8 presented a unique opportunity for license holders, especially those in Philadelphia, to take advantage of extended operating hours during this period of increased economic and tourism activity.

To maintain strong safety standards, participating businesses were required to complete a city-approved nighttime safety training program to demonstrate commitment to the health and safety of both patrons and employees.

The strong bipartisan support for this law reflects our shared commitment to maximizing economic opportunity while prioritizing public safety during a historic moment for the Commonwealth.

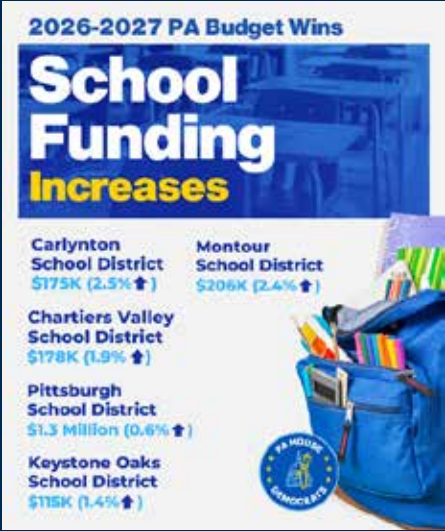


CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

As the majority chair of the House Liquor Control Committee, I'm focused on modernizing Pennsylvania's alcohol laws to better serve our communities and ensure public safety.

2026-27 BUDGET

I was proud to vote YES on the 2026-27 state budget. Pennsylvania families deserve a budget that makes life more affordable, strengthens our communities, and creates opportunities for the future. That's exactly what the 2026-27 state budget delivers, without raising taxes!



I am proud my budget vote gets our school districts more money to teach our children and protect taxpayers. We're also strengthening schools with continued investments in school safety, special education, career training, and higher education.



We also voted to give Allegheny County's retired teachers, police officers, and firefighters a long-overdue raise that reflects the increase to the cost of living.

This budget is focused on practical solutions that help families succeed today while building a stronger Pennsylvania for tomorrow. By investing in education, affordability, public safety, and economic opportunity, we're delivering results that improve everyday life for Pennsylvanians.

BRINGING STATE FUNDING HOME

An important part of my job as your state representative is to bring state funding to our community. I'm proud to have secured nearly \$6 million in state funding this year to support the following important projects in Crafton, Scott Township, and parts of the city of Pittsburgh:

- **\$113,150** to AGEWELL at the JCC South Hills to modernize facilities, provide new health and entertainment programs, upgrade technology, and enhance nutrition services.
- **\$164,750** to local nonprofit Open Field's Future Forward soccer program, which serves immigrant, refugee and other marginalized youth across Allegheny County.
- **\$500,000** for Pittsburgh Musical Theater to transform the space into a state-of-the-art, fully accessible venue.
- **\$500,000** for new roof and rooftop solar array at one of Giant Eagle's OK Grocery distribution centers.
- **\$800,000** for Hill Top Villas transformative senior housing in Pittsburgh's Fairywood neighborhood.
- **\$900,000** for constructing a new Emmaus Community Welcome Center.
- **\$1 million** to Eastern Atlantic States Carpenters Tech for construction of the 652 Ridge Road Outdoor Training Space.
- **\$2 million** to ACTION-Housing Inc. for the Crafton Towers renovation project, including crucial upgrades to the building's electrical, HVAC and plumbing systems.

I will continue fighting to ensure our tax dollars are invested back into the communities that need them most.

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program makes it easier for older and disabled folks to stay in their homes while affording groceries, medicine, and so much more. Nearly 376,000 Pennsylvanians have already benefited from this program in 2026. Don't miss out! The deadline has been extended until December 31.
