Have You Applied for Your PA 2025 Property Tax/Rent Rebate?

Pennsylvanians age 65 and older, widows and widowers age 50 and older, and Pennsylvanians with disabilities age 18 and older have until Dec. 31 to apply for a rebate of up to \$1,000 through the state's 2025 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program. Assistance through my office is always available and free of charge. The income limit is \$48,110 per year for both homeowners and renters, and half of all Social Security income is excluded from the calculation.

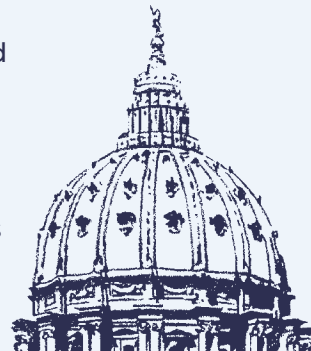
If you have already received a rebate from the state, you may also be eligible for a local school district tax rebate. Visit my office or call us at (215) 259-5962 for assistance applying and more details.

This is why I will continue advocating for the passage of HB 739, ensuring that all Pennsylvanians have access to quality, affordable healthcare close to home.



It is always a pleasure to welcome the fourth-grade class from Queen of Angels to the Capitol. The students took a tour, learned about how state government works, and visited the PA State Museum to explore the culture and natural history of our state.



I was thrilled to see my Green Star Banner legislation pass the House unanimously. House Bill 2449 recognizes the need to do more to support our troops when they return home while providing a meaningful way for Pennsylvania to honor veteran families who have lost a loved one to suicide.



Being able to attend the Governor's Annual Pride Reception was a highlight of my time in Harrisburg. The event focused on the importance of family within the LGBTQ+ community, the supportive role families play, and the importance of standing up for members of the community — both children and adults.

IN THE COMMUNITY



In March, we held our annual Expungement Clinic at the Upper Moreland Free Public Library. Along with Senator Maria Collett and the Montgomery County Public Defender's Office, we were able to assist several individuals by helping them expunge their records if they were eligible.



Mental health is such an important topic of conversation. Supporting groups like NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) helps provide resources and support to individuals who are experiencing a crisis or facing mental health challenges. Giving back to the community is one of my favorite parts of serving in this office. I sponsor Little League teams in both Hatboro and Upper Moreland, and attending the Opening Day ceremonies is a special tradition each year. I'm honored to be a part of these events and support our young athletes.

The Keith Valley Challenge is always one of my favorite annual community events! This year marked the 50th anniversary of the eighth-grade hockey tournament, which raises money for the Make-A-Wish Foundation.



I was thrilled to tour the Resilience Resource Center's new facility in Huntingdon Valley. They offer a variety of programs for the LGBTQ+ community that are integral to building resilience, fostering growth, and promoting optimism, hope, gratitude, and self-care.

The Bears Barista is a coffee shop run entirely by students in the B.E.A.R.S. Transition Program at Upper Moreland High School. Stop by and grab a coffee or some baked goods! The student servers will certainly put a smile on your face.



Shred and E-Waste events are among our most popular events of the year. This spring, we held a joint event with the Lower Moreland Police Department, where residents dropped off their shredding and e-waste items. Our next Shred/E-Waste event will be held on Oct. 24 at Upper Moreland High School.

Our Senior Fair was a huge success! Held in partnership with Rep. Melissa Cerrato and Rep. Ben Sanchez, the event featured more than 40 vendors and welcomed over 200 seniors who attended and collected valuable information and resources. Thank you to all our attendees and vendors for helping make this event an annual success.



I was able to attend the new Willow Grove YMCA pavilion dedication ceremony in May. The pavilions create welcoming spaces where programs can grow and communities can come together. Projects like this show what's possible when community partners work together with a shared vision.
