#### IT'S TIME TO RAISE THE MINIMUM WAGE!

But now is the time to do what's right. Now is the time to raise the minimum wage in Pennsylvania.

I am committed to standing firm on this issue. I believe in doing what's right. Ensuring that hardworking Pennsylvanians - like the people who bag our groceries, pump our fuel and prepare our lunch - can earn a living they can actually live on is the right thing.

I want you to know that this issue is incredibly important to me and I will continue to do all I can in Harrisburg to work toward the goal of raising the minimum wage in Pennsylvania.



## **FILL OUT THE 2020 CENSUS**

Every 10 years, the United States conducts a census. This count of U.S. residents helps determine how \$675 billion is spent by the federal government and how Pennsylvania is represented in Congress for the next 10 years.

An accurate census count could mean better roads and bridges, kids having better access to quality schools, better access to restaurants and shops and better public safety. Plus, federal funding for programs such as CHIP, Medicaid, SNAP and WIC are based on responses to the 2020 Census.

Visit 2020Census.gov beginning April 1 to make sure you're counted in the 2020 Census.

You'll be able to respond online, by paper or over the phone. The census will be printed in English and Spanish, and accommodations are available for those with visual or hearing impairments. Telephone assistance will be available in 13 languages.
