Dear Neighbor,

I talked about my top three priorities when meeting Gov. Tom Wolf for the first time after taking office. My priorities included: fair funding, fair funding, fair funding. I repeated this story in February when the governor traveled to Upper Darby High School to talk about his budget proposal to fully fund public education. Thankfully, this finally appears to be a real possibility.

I'm hopeful that this year, when Pennsylvania has a historic budget surplus, our state can finally fully fund all public schools. For Upper Darby and William Penn, that could mean receiving enough state funding to address the biggest needs in our schools.

My work this legislative session continues to focus on policies that can have life-changing effects in our community. I have continued to look for solutions to reform PA's juvenile justice system and hosted a policy hearing on issues involving sentencing.

My office continues to look for ways to support local neighborhoods, including the approval of more than \$100,000 in grants for first responders announced in February. We don't need to look any further than the medivac helicopter crash in Drexel Hill for the reason why we need to support our volunteer and fulltime first responders. This terrible incident could have been much worse, but no lives were lost, and volunteers and first responders spent hours cleaning the scene.

My office will also continue to participate in food collection drives and park and green space clean-up events. We will continue hosting community events, and for the first time host an art contest for elementary school children.

AROUND THE **DISTRICT**

I enjoyed the return of several in-person events before COVID-19 cases spiked again this winter. One of them included the St. Andrew 5K Spirit Run.

My office hosted a Mental Health & Wellness Expo to spotlight the numerous services available in our community for residents.

During the pandemic, I have volunteered to help food drives, including the Thanksgiving food drive with Clifton Heights Boy Scouts Troop 111.

I tried to attend all our community's holiday events, including the Aldan Christmas Tree Lighting and the Upper Darby Summer Stage Holiday Spectacular.

I have participated in the Rally for Funding Public Schools, worked as an advocate for criminal justice reform - including the "Care, Not Control" campaign – and hosted the House **Democratic Policy Committee to** hear from experts on the issues with sentencing in PA.















In February, thanks to the Pennsylvania State Education Association, I joined the conversation about the important work being done throughout the pandemic by education support professionals, also called ESPs, who work as custodians, bus drivers, cafeteria workers, paraprofessionals and school secretaries.

My office joined other state lawmakers in collecting more than 3,000 diapers, baby formula and wipes for families in need during the December holiday season.

In February, I joined Gov. Tom Wolf, state lawmakers, school officials and Upper Darby High School students to ask the state to fully fund our public schools.

HELICOPTER CRASH IN DREXEL HILL





After his helicopter experienced mechanical issues, former military pilot Danial Moore crash-landed a LifeNet Eurocopter on the lawn of Drexel Hill United Methodist Church on Jan. 11. He somehow avoided all buildings, telephone poles and wires. Moore was the only one on board who suffered injuries that needed surgery. The nurse pulled Moore to safety, and the flight medic handed off the patient, a 2-month-old girl, before extinguishing the onboard fire. En route from Chambersburg to CHOP, Moore said he regained consciousness after the crash to see a whole company of firefighters looking down at him. "That's a real good feeling," he told the Philadelphia Inquirer.

I would like to echo Moore's gratitude and thank all the people who ran toward a burning helicopter to help that day – as well as the scores of people involved in the aftermath and cleanup. We had some amazing people do amazing things to save lives and keep our community safe.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

HOUSE BILL 709: This bill moved out of the State Government Committee by unanimous vote, hopefully signaling that one day this bill would change the way business is conducted in Harrisburg. The bill aims to stop Pay to Play practices, where campaign contributions and not quality of work and bid price determine what companies are awarded valuable state contracts.

HB 1034: This bill would strengthen the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification (WARN) Act. It would require businesses that are closing to provide employees with 180 days' notice if the business has more than 50 employees or if the mass layoff includes more than 500 workers. During the pandemic, we witnessed how difficult it could be for families to navigate unemployment compensation and wait for payment. By providing workers with more warning, families have time to adjust their finances.

HB 2179: This bill would ensure employees who work hard are treated fairly. Since January 2020, PA has documented about 300 WARN Act mass layoffs. While corporate profits and CEO perks and bonuses are higher than ever, many workers' wages have been stagnant for years. This bill would require workers in mass layoffs to be provided with severance pay, health insurance and necessary protections.
