As we welcome fall to the Susquehanna Valley, I want to send my best wishes to you and your family. It has been a busy and productive year both in the Capitol and in our District Office, where our team continues working hard to deliver resources across our community. Since this spring, we have put thousands of dollars directly back into constituents' pockets through Property Tax & Rent Rebates and Unclaimed Property claims, while assisting neighbors with state agency issues ranging from vehicle titles to unemployment benefits. With the passage of this summer's state budget, we secured \$13 million in increased funding for our schools, \$5 million to strengthen the child care workforce, and a guarantee of recess for our elementary school students. We are also proud to have brought an additional \$6 million in grants home to our local governments and community organizations. It is an honor to serve our community, and I look forward to continuing our work together.



Fútbol Day

The Capitol Rotunda was buzzing with energy as we officially celebrated Fútbol Day in PA! Pennsylvania hosted six World Cup games in Philadelphia, and we gathered in the State Capitol to celebrate the power of *the beautiful game*, a sport that unifies communities and instills vital lessons of teamwork, hard work, and leadership. We were thrilled to be joined by coaches, students, parents, and youth and collegiate soccer players from across the region, alongside local sports royalty: Harrisburg Heat legend Richard Chinapoo and his teammates. A special thank you to Visit Hershey & Harrisburg for helping make this day possible, and to Hershey native and Team USA captain Christian Pulisic for sending a special message to inspire the next generation of players right here in our Commonwealth.

Child Care

20% increase for workforce recruitment and retention and increase in grant amounts.

Student Wellness

A required 30-minute daily recess for all K-5 students.

Seniors & Retirees

A cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for pre-2001 public sector retirees like teachers, firefighters, and first responders.

**Protecting You from
Predatory Surge Pricing**

Major retailers are increasingly switching to electronic shelf labels. This technology opens the door to dynamic or “surge” pricing, where prices for everyday groceries can spike based on the time of day or the weather, unfairly squeezing working families. I introduced a bill to prohibit the use of dynamic pricing via electronic price tags, so you can shop without facing predatory price hikes. I am proud to share that this bill recently passed out of committee with bipartisan support!



**Lowering Energy Bills &
Strengthening Our Power Grid**

Extreme weather, aging infrastructure, and rising tech demands are straining our power grid and driving up utility bills. To fix this, I have introduced legislation to establish Virtual Power Plant (VPP) programs. By voluntarily linking smart devices, like thermostats and EV chargers, during peak demand, VPPs prevent blackouts, cut energy costs, and pay participating residents for protecting our grid. My bill passed the House with bipartisan support and a 107-95 vote.



Protecting Families from Abrupt Child Care Closures

When a local child care center abruptly closed recently, families and staff were left in a bind. As one local teacher reminded me, children are our most important community members. I am introducing legislation requiring licensed child care facilities to give 30 days’ notice before closing, giving parents and teachers time to adapt. My bill was reported out of committee by a vote of 14-12.
