WORKING FOR YOU AT HOME AND IN HARRISBURG



This past June, I was in Harrisburg working with members of both parties to put together a budget that works for all Pennsylvanians. I am determined to make sure that your interests are represented in the State House, and that our Commonwealth is investing in worthwhile programs - not government waste.



On May 5, we remembered Sgt. Jaime Junior Roman, a Philadelphia police officer who was horrifically gunned down during a traffic stop in 2024. As the co-chair of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives Law Enforcement Caucus, I provided a PA House resolution honoring the sergeant's memory and presented it to his wife and young son.



I was thrilled to tour Sky Martial Arts in Warrington and discuss the importance of self-defense, discipline, and physical activity. As a former police officer, I recognize the importance of proper self-defense in not only protecting oneself but also de-escalating dangerous situations without having to rely on a service weapon to do so.



I hosted a Real ID Clinic at William Tennent High School alongside PennDOT, the Bucks County Register of Wills office, and U.S. Sen. John Fetterman's office to answer questions about the rollout of Real ID in Pennsylvania.



I had a wonderful time hosting an open house and grand reopening for our expanded office - thank you to everyone who showed up! It was a pleasure chatting with you and giving you a tour of the building!

PA 250



To celebrate our district's storied history, and to recognize the 250th anniversary of our great nation, our office is posting videos recognizing important places and people from Warminster, Ivyland, Warrington, and New Britain. LAW ENFORCEMENT CAUCUS UPDATES



The bipartisan Law Enforcement Caucus hosted its second quarter meeting in June at the FOP Lodge in Harrisburg. We discussed several bills and resolutions that we are working hard to get passed by the House. These include:

- House Bill 1384, prime sponsored by state Rep. Emily Kinkead (D-Allegheny) to limit solitary confinement for juveniles.
- A bill prime sponsored by state Rep. Tarik Kahn (D-Phila.) to create a Youth Engagement Grant Program to create police-youth mentorship programs for troubled youths.
- A bill prime sponsored by state Rep. Chris Pielli (D-Chester) to make corrections officers eligible for line-of-duty death benefits if they die by suicide due to PTSD or depression.

We've also made swift progress on things we discussed at our inaugural meeting in April. I'm thrilled with how quickly my Democratic and Republican colleagues have come together to move these pieces of legislation forward:

- House Resolution 48, adopted 203-0, and recognizes May 11-17 as National Police Week and May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day.
- House Resolution 176, adopted 203-0, honors the memory of law enforcement officers who lost their lives in the line of duty.
- House Bill 237, Bryan's Law, was referred to the House Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness Committee for consideration. This bill would provide families of first responders who die by suicide resulting from work-related PTSD the same death benefits as families of officers who die in the line of duty.
- A bill that would create a pre-qualification fitness program for people who wish to attend a Municipal Police Officer's Education & Training (MPOETC) police academy, to be prime sponsored by Rep. Jim Rigby (R-Cambria & Somerset).
