

On Thursday, Aug. 3, after a bipartisan vote in the House and Senate the previous month, the state budget was finally sent by the Senate to Gov. Josh Shapiro for his signature, allowing critical funding to flow to school districts, counties, and programs across the commonwealth. Along with my colleagues in both chambers, I worked to increase funding with more than \$202.95 million in funding for DEP, \$80.26 million in funding for public schools within Allegheny County, and \$8 million in the Workforce Development Program. With this support, we can begin to work to address environmental issues, reform Pennsylvania's public school funding system and continue to recruit and retain workers by keeping Pennsylvania open for business. As you read, you'll find additional information on my upcoming events, legislation, and the recent expansion of the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program. TOUR OF THE CENTER FOR ORGAN RECOVERY AND EDUCATION



Along with Democratic Policy Committee Chair Rep. Ryan Bizzarro and House Health Committee Chair Rep. Dan Frankel, I was honored to host my House Democratic Policy Committee colleagues for a tour of the Center for Organ Recovery and Education (CORE) in our district last month. Our discussion largely focused on ways to increase opportunities to register as a donor.

The center is one of 57 federally designated not-for-profit organ procurement organizations in the United States. CORE partners with more than 150 hospitals and health care facilities to deliver the gift of life by coordinating the surgical recovery of organs, tissues and corneas for transplantation. CORE also facilitates the computerized matching of donated organs, tissues, and corneas. CORE's goal is to bridge the gap between donor families, health care providers and transplant recipients to transform lives.

One organ donor can save the lives of eight people and improve the lives of 75 more people. Right now, Pennsylvanians can register as an organ donor through the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation; however, with the shift to online services, it's left fewer opportunities for registration. That is why along with my colleagues Rep. Ryan Bizzarro and Rep. Dan Frankel, I will introduce legislation to provide more opportunities for people to make this life-saving decision.

EXPANSION OF THE PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE PROGRAM

In 2024, the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program will expand to increase eligibility, help more people stay in their homes and communities, and provide more financial relief.

Now that it's law, the program gets better than ever by:

- Increasing the maximum income limit from \$35,000 to \$45,000 for homeowners.
- Increasing the maximum income limit from \$15,000 to \$45,000 for renters.
- Increasing the income limit to grow with inflation, beginning in the claim year 2024.
- Increasing the maximum rebate from \$650 to \$1,000.

In Allegheny County, 16,500 more people will qualify for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate.
